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Notification Letters

On July 21, 2000, a notification letter was sent to electronic media claim (EMC) submitters regarding Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) changes associated with the transition from United HealthCare to HealthNow NY, Inc. This letter contains timely and important information, which may require a response. Please take note of the following highlights from the letter.

- The change in contractor from United HealthCare to HealthNow NY, Inc. will require a change to the Receiver ID number used with claims submissions. The current Receiver ID number is 10555, which will need to be updated to the new Receiver ID number, which is 00811. This new number must be used for claims received at the DMERC Bulletin Board beginning 8:00 a.m. EDT, Tuesday, September 26, 2000.
- Suppliers who are currently utilizing Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) will need to establish a new EFT agreement with HealthNow NY, Inc. An updated EFT agreement is included with the letter. New EFT agreements must be received no later than August 25, 2000. This letter was sent to 750 EFT recipients, and, as of August 14, 2000, we have received only 250 responses. If you currently receive EFT benefits through United HealthCare for your DMERC Region A services, and you neglect to return an updated EFT agreement to HealthNow NY, Inc., your United HealthCare EFT agreement will become null and void. You will then have to go through the re-enrollment process after the transition.

Bulletin Board System (BBS) Dark Days

From Thursday, September 21, 2000, 12:00 p.m. EDT, through Tuesday, September 26, 2000, 8:00 a.m. EDT, there will be no electronic access to the Bulletin Board System (BBS). During this time, you will be unable to perform electronic functions (e.g., claim transmission, claim status inquiry, eligibility verification). Our customer service representatives will also be unable to access claim status and eligibility information during this time; they will be able to provide only general coverage information. On Tuesday, September 26, 2000, at 8:00 a.m. EDT, claims processing functions will return to the original schedule.
